1 External Connector	Connect Micro USB Cable
2 Proximity/ Light sensor	Proximity sensor: Prevents accidental operation of Touchscreen during a call. Light sensor: Detects brightness of surroundings.
3 Receiver/ Speaker	Other party's voice sounds here for calls. This is positioned to the left, so position your ear accordingly.
4 Touchscreen Display	Tap, Swipe/Flick, etc.
5 Notification Lamp	Lights/blinks to indicate handset status
6 Mic	Speak here for calls. Take care to avoid blocking Mic with your fingers.

Heat Generation

USIM Card may get hot while in use, but that is not abnormal. Please continue to use it.

Handling

Do not drop USIM Card or subject it to impact. Such handling could break it.

Inserting and Removing USIM Card

Do not apply unnecessary force.

SD Card Installation

Handset accepts microSDHC/microSD Card up to 32 GB. Some SD Cards may not operate properly.

Battery Care

Replacing Battery

Replace Battery if operating time shortens noticeably.

Cleaning Charging Terminals

Clean device charging terminals with dry cotton swabs.

Lithium-ion Battery

This product requires a lithium-ion Battery. Lithiumion batteries are recyclable. To recycle a used lithiumion Battery, take it to any shop displaying the recycling symbol.
