Formatting SD Card

When using a new SD Card for the first time, format it on handset before trying to save files, etc.







Lithium-ion Battery

Battery Usage Notes

General

Charge battery at least once every six months; uncharged battery may die or affect files/settings.

Battery Life

Replace battery if operating time shortens noticeably.

• Depending on usage, bulges may appear near end of battery life; this does not affect safety.

Maintenance

Clean device charging terminals with dry cotton swabs.



USB Charge

Connect handset to a PC via Micro USB Cable.

- · Power on handset and PC first.
- \cdot Battery may not charge if SD Card is not inserted.
- Handset may power on automatically when connected to a PC via Micro USB Cable; avoid connection aboard aircraft or in hospitals, etc. where handset use is prohibited.
- \cdot Battery may not charge or charge slowly depending on PC status/environment.


