### Other Notations

In the User Guide, the product is referred to as "handset."

microSD™/microSDHC™ Card is referred to as "SD Card."

"501KC" here refers to this mobile phone "DIGNO® ケータイ (Keitai)."



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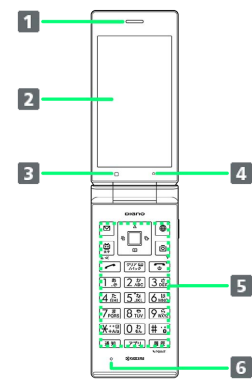

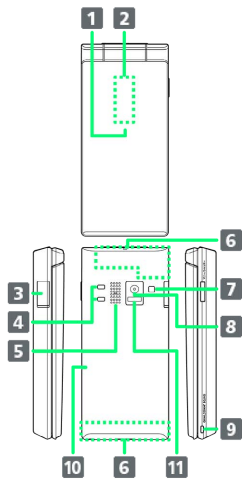

### Handset Parts



Name	Description
<b>1</b> Earpiece	Hear other party's voice through this.
<b>2</b> Display	Screens appear here.
<b>3</b> Brightness Sensor	Detects surrounding brightness.
<b>4</b> Air Pressure Holes	Maintain handset performance. Do not cover with sticker, etc.
<b>5</b> Touch Area	Use as touchpad when Touch Pointer is on.
<b>6</b> Mic	Talk to other party through this.

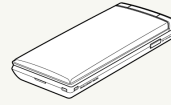


Name	Description
<b>1</b> Incoming/Charging LED	Illuminates while charging or for notifications (missed calls, new messages, etc.).
<b>2</b> Sub-display	Clock and Notification Indicators for new calls, mail, etc. appear.
<b>3</b> External Device Port	Connect AC Charger, etc.
<b>4</b> Charging Terminals (for Desktop Holder)	Connect to Desktop Holder during charging.
<b>5</b> Speaker	Listen to music, video sound, TV, etc.
<b>6</b> Internal Communications Antennas	Used for calling, Internetting, etc. Avoid covering with stickers or fingers.
<b>7</b> Capture Light/Flashlight	Use as lighting when capturing images or as a flashlight.
<b>8</b> Camera	Capture photos and videos.
<b>9</b> Straphole	Attach a strap.
<b>10</b> Back Cover	Remove to access USIM Card, SD Card, and Battery.
<b>11</b> Infrared Port	Use for infrared transmission.

## SIM Unlocking

## Handset Memory/SD Card

Handset supports SD Card up to 32 GB. Some SD Cards may not operate properly.

Handset memory is available for saving system data, applications, captured photos and movies, and other data.

### ! Handset Memory/SD Card Cautions

#### Content Saved to Handset Memory/SD Card Files

Content in handset memory/SD Card may be lost/alterd due to accidents, malfunctions, repairs, handset upgrade/replacement, or other handling. Back up important content regularly. SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages resulting from loss/alteration of content.

- Do not forcefully install or remove SD Card.
- Do not touch terminals with hands or metal.
- Never power off while files are being accessed.
- Be careful that data does not become erased or overwritten.

#### microSDHC Cards

Handset supports SDHC SD cards (microSDHC cards). microSDHC cards can only be used with SDHC devices.

#### Save Location

By default, photos and videos captured with handset are saved to handset memory.

### SD Card Precaution

Keep SD Card away from infants; may cause choking if swallowed.

### Inserting SD Card

Always power off beforehand.

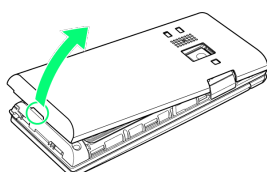
At time of purchase, a protective card is inserted in SD Card Slot. Remove before installing an SD Card.

## Charging Battery

Charge Battery inserted in handset.



### Incoming/Charging LED

Lights red during charging, and goes out once charging completes.

- Incoming/Charging LED flashing while charging indicates an abnormality with Charger, Battery, or that equipment has reached the end of its service life, and that Battery is not charging properly. Check that Charger and other equipment are SoftBank-specified items. If you are using specified products only, contact a SoftBank Shop or [SoftBank Customer Support](#), General Information.



### Charging Cautions

#### Water Resistance

The optional AC Charger and Desktop Holder are not waterproof. Never connect Micro USB plug while handset or AC Charger is wet.

Handset is water resistant; however, if Micro USB plug is inserted while it is wet, liquid (tap water, beverage, sea water, pet urine, etc.) or a foreign object adhered to handset or Micro USB plug may cause overheating, burnout, fire, malfunction, burns, etc. due to electric shock, short-circuiting, etc.

#### Handling Cables

Do not pull, bend, or twist cable; may damage the cable.

SoftBank Corp. is not liable for problems resulting from charging handset abroad.

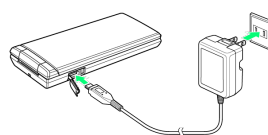

### Backlight

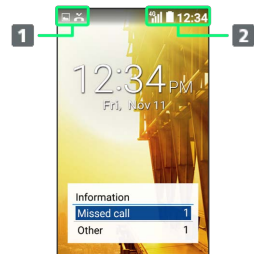

# Security Codes

## Code Types

The following codes are required for handset use. Operation Password can be user-set and changed on handset.

Code	Description
Operation Password	Code for applications and functions requiring a security setting. By default, not set.
PIN/Password	Code for unlocking screen. By default, not set.
Center Access Code	4-number code set at time of subscription. Used when changing subscription details and optional services from a landline telephone.

### If Security Code is Unsaved

If a code is required by an application or function, a prompt to save a code appears.

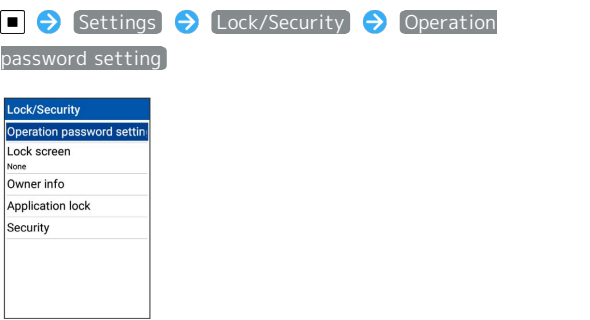

## USIM PIN

### USIM PIN and USIM Card Lock

When USIM card lock is enabled, PIN (a code for USIM Card) is required for handset use each time handset is powered on; helps prevent unauthorized use by others.

- Enable USIM card lock by enabling PIN.
- PIN is 9999 by default.

### PIN Entry Cautions

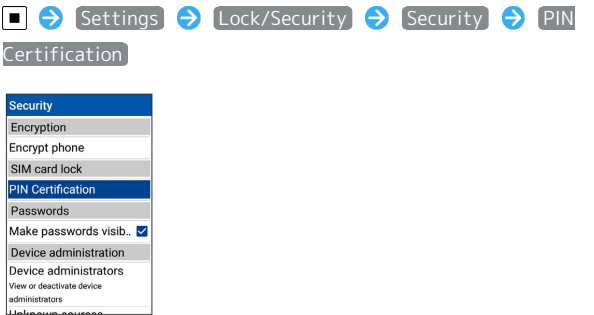
PIN entry is required when changing PIN, when powering handset on with USIM card lock enabled, etc.

- Entering incorrect PIN three consecutive times activates PIN Lock. To cancel, Personal Unblocking Key (PUK) is required; contact [SoftBank Customer Support](#), General Information.
- Entering incorrect PUK ten consecutive times activates PUK Lock, disabling handset. For recovery, USIM Card must be reissued at a SoftBank Shop (fees apply).

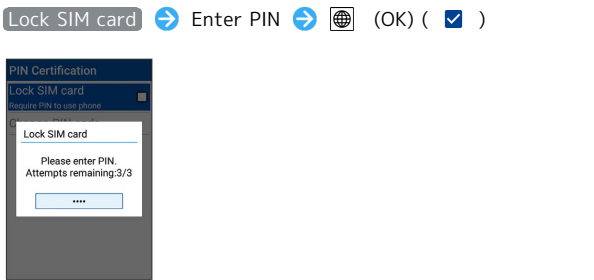

When calling, texting, photographing, using games or the Internet, or when viewing TV or listening to music, be sure to check around you for safety.

Use without checking for safety may cause someone to fall over or a traffic accident.



Compulsory

Be careful with volume of a headset.

Difficulty hearing around you may result in an accident.

Prohibited

Do not look into Infrared Port when sending data by infrared.

Do not mistake orientation of USIM Card and SD Card (commercially available) or where to insert.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Compulsory

Do not allow direct sunlight, etc. to shine on Camera Lens for long period.

Concentration of light by the lens may cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



Compulsory

Before boarding an aircraft, power off handset or place handset in Airplane mode.

Restrictions are in place for use aboard aircraft; follow airline instructions.

May affect aircraft instrumentation.

Prohibited use aboard an aircraft may be punishable by law.



Compulsory

Follow instructions of each medical institution for use in a hospital.

Power off handset where use is prohibited.

May affect electronic devices and electric medical equipment.



Compulsory

Always power off handset when using hands-free calling, the ringtone is sounding, or when waiting for a call.

Using handset with sheet attached may cause injury. Be careful of injuring fingers when removing.

Read battery label to confirm battery type; use/dispose of Battery accordingly.

Prohibited

Do not pierce, hammer, step on, or otherwise subject to excessive force.


May cause Battery to ignite, rupture, overheat, or leak, resulting in fire, burns, injury, etc.



Compulsory

If matter from inside Battery gets into eyes, immediately rinse with clean water without rubbing, and consult a doctor.

Matter from Battery may result in loss of eyesight, etc.



Prohibited

Do not short-circuit the (+) and (-) terminals.

May cause Battery to rupture, ignite, or overheat.



Prohibited

Do not insert Battery in handset with (+) and (-) reversed.

May cause Battery to rupture, ignite, or overheat. If there is trouble inserting Battery, do not force Battery and check connection points.



Do Not Use Wet Hands

Never handle with wet hands.

May cause overheating, electric shock, fire, malfunction, etc.

## ⚠ WARNING



Prohibited

If you notice an unusual odor, overheating, discoloration, deformation, etc., do not use Battery.

Battery ignition, rupture, overheating, leakage may cause fire, burns, injury, etc.



Compulsory

If Battery is leaking or has an unusual odor, immediately discontinue use and keep it away from open flames.

Leaking fluid may ignite, causing ignition, rupturing, etc.

Do not forcibly insert/remove Battery.

May damage Battery or Back Cover, and cause injury.

Prohibited

Do not use AC Charger if cord is damaged.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Prohibited

Do not use AC Charger or Desktop Holder in a bathroom or other humid place.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Prohibited

If thunder is audible, do not touch AC Charger.

May cause electric shock.



Prohibited

Do not short-circuit Charging Terminals while plugged in. Do not touch Charging Terminals with hands, fingers, etc.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Prohibited

Do not subject AC Charger cord to excessive force (placing heavy objects on it, pulling, etc.).

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Prohibited

When plugging in/unplugging AC Charger, do not allow anything metal (metal strap, etc.) to come in contact.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Prohibited

Do not use a travel converter with AC Charger.

May cause ignition, overheating, electric shock, etc.



Prohibited

Do not apply excessive force to where AC Charger is connected to handset or Desktop Holder.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do Not Use Wet Hands

Do not touch AC Charger cord, Charging Terminals, power plug, or Desktop Holder with wet hands.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Compulsory

Use with the specified power source at the specified voltage.

If charging while abroad, charge with an AC Charger compatible with use abroad.

Use with an incorrect power source or voltage may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

AC Chargers compatible with use abroad: 100 V to 240 V AC (be sure to connect only to household AC outlet)



Compulsory

Wipe away dust on power plug.

Using with dust on plug may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Compulsory

When plugging in AC Charger, plug in firmly.

Failing to do so may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Compulsory

When unplugging, hold by AC Charger and do not pull by cord or otherwise subject to excessive force.

Pulling by cord can damage cord, causing fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Compulsory

When connecting/disconnecting AC Charger from handset, insert/remove straight from terminal without bending, and without pulling by cord or otherwise subjecting to excessive force.

Do not charge a wet Battery.

May cause electric shock or malfunction.



Prohibited

Do not use in way that exceeds the rating for outlets or wiring.

Exceeding rating such as with a power bar may cause AC Charger to ignite, overheat, or a fire.



Prohibited

Do not damage, cut, twist, pull, or place heavy objects on cable, or use bundled up. Do not use damaged cable.

May cause ignition, fire, electric shock, or short-circuiting.



Compulsory

When connecting AC Charger to handset or Desktop Holder, always hold by plug body and insert straight. Always hold by plug body when removing.

Pulling by cable may damage cable or cause ignition, fire, or electric shock.

Do not carelessly touch or short-circuit IC (metal) portion of USIM Card.

May cause loss of data or malfunction.



Prohibited

Do not scratch IC (metal) portion of USIM Card.

May cause malfunction.



Avoid Liquids Or Moisture

Do not wet USIM Card.

May cause malfunction.

## Handset Use & Electronic Medical Equipment

### ⚠ WARNING



Compulsory

When carrying handset, keep a minimum of 15 cm from implanted cardiac pacemaker, implanted defibrillator, etc.

Radio waves may interfere with the operation of electric medical devices.



Compulsory

When using electronic medical equipment (other than implanted cardiac pacemaker/defibrillator) outside of medical institutions, consult device manufacturer about the influence of radio waves.

Radio waves may interfere with the operation of electric medical equipment.

### Usage Basics

- Content saved on handset (Phone Book, mail, music, photos, videos, etc.) may be altered or erased due to accident, malfunction/repair, or other handling. Keep a copy of important content. SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages or lost profit resulting from alteration or loss of content.
- Do not use in places with much dust or vibration.
- Use of handset near a landline phone, TV, or radio may affect the image and sound quality of the equipment.
- Depending on conditions of use (in call, using Internet or mail, charging, etc.), handset and USIM Card may become warm. This is not a defect or malfunction.
- Be sure to charge Battery before using handset for the first time or if handset has not been used for a long time. (During charging, Battery may become warm. This is not a defect or malfunction.)
- Depending on usage, bulges may appear on Battery near end of battery life. This is normal for lithium-ion batteries and does not affect safety.
- Sticker on handset bearing the manufacture number (in Battery Compartment) is certification that your SoftBank handset is licensed under the Radio Law and Telecommunications Business Law. Do not remove.
- Mail saved on handset, downloaded content (whether paid for or free), etc. cannot be transferred to an exchange SoftBank handset (replacing old handset, submitting handset for repairs, etc.).
- When using handset in public places, take care not to annoy other people around you.
- Wearing polarized sunglasses may cause Display to appear dark or distorted at certain angles.
- Be sure to center Earpiece over ear to hear Earpiece sound. Your ear may block Earpiece (sound hole) and prevent clear sound.
- Trying to use keys during content playback may cause content to stop or other abnormal operation.
- Surrounding brightness is detected by Brightness Sensor. Avoid covering Sensor.
- Keeping Viewfinder open or shooting videos, operating Browser, etc. repeatedly for a continuous and extended period causes handset to become warm. Skin contact for extended period when handset is warm may cause low-temperature burns.
- Handset may become warm depending on usage and where used, and some functions (charging, etc.) will stop as a precaution. Handset powers off if use is continued while warm.
- If a message appears indicating error due to temperature while External Device Port is in use, immediately disconnect cable.
- SD Card (commercially available) may feel warm when removed from handset after prolonged use. This is not a defect or malfunction.

- Do not use or store SD Card (commercially available) in place where static electricity or electrical noise occurs easily.
- Back up content on an SD (commercially available) Card to a PC or other media (FD, MO, CD-RW, etc.). SoftBank Corp. is not liable for any damages resulting from loss of content due to SD Card (commercially available) breakage or other failure.
- Do not forget lock number/password for unlocking screen. If you do forget it, take handset to a SoftBank Shop to reset it. This will erase all handset information and settings.

- Excess weight on handset may damage Display or internal parts, resulting in malfunction. Do not sit with handset in pocket or place at bottom of bag with other heavy objects. Even without exterior damage, it will not be covered under warranty.

- Clean Port/Terminals with a dry cotton swab, etc. occasionally. If dirty, may cause poor connection. Do not apply force and deform or scratch terminals.
- To clean handset, wipe it with a dry, soft cloth. Do not use benzene, thinner, alcohol, soap, or other solvents. Doing so may discolor or remove exterior features or print.
- Before removing Battery, power off handset and wait for Display to dim. Not doing so may cause saved content to be altered or erased.
- Do not remove sticker from Battery.
- Usable battery time decreases in extreme temperature conditions (left in car with closed windows on a hot day, etc.). Battery life also shortens. Using handset at room temperature is recommended.

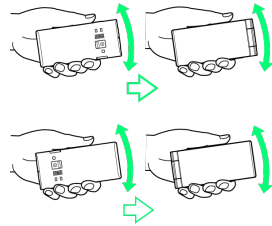

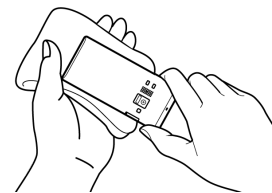
Shake handset as shown until there is no more wetting

- Hold handset firmly so as not to drop it.

Gently push handset against a lint-free dry, clean cloth and wipe water away from Mic, Earpiece, Speaker, Air Pressure Holes, hinge, etc.

After removing as much water as possible, leave handset at room temperature for at least 1 hour

- Some water may still remain in handset. Do not leave handset beside/in items that you do not want to get wet (clothing, bag, etc.).

## When Charging

Accessories are not waterproof. Check the following before and after charging.

- Check that handset is not wet. If wet, drain water and then wipe with a lint-free dry, clean cloth before opening External Device Port Cover, etc.
- If charging after becoming wet, drain well and then wipe with a lint-free dry, clean cloth before opening External Device Port Cover, etc.
- DO NOT charge wet handset. Charging while wet may result in malfunction, overheating, etc.
- Do not touch AC Charger (sold separately) or Desktop Holder (sold separately) with wet hands. May cause electric shock.
- Do not use AC Charger (sold separately) or Desktop Holder (sold separately) where exposed to water. May cause fire or electric shock.
- Do not use AC Charger (sold separately) or Desktop Holder (sold separately) in a bathroom, shower, kitchen, near a sink, or other place where water is used. May cause fire or electric shock.
