Data Communication

- Since constant Internet connection is possible with the product, data communication may be performed automatically.
- If you transmit a large amount of data, such as when downloading applications or watching video, data communication charges become high. Therefore, subscription to the flat-rate service for data communication charges is recommended.
- Depending on applications and services used, transmission fees may be incurred even while connected by Wi-Fi.

Unlocking Screen

Screen Lock

After a period of inactivity, Display turns off to save battery power (Screen lock active).

Screen lock prevents accidental Touchscreen operation.



 \cdot Press Power Key while Display is on to lock screen manually.

If Screen Lock Activates while Playing Music

Music continues to play. For operation, Press Power Key to open lock screen and use operation panel (operations may vary depending on application).

Text Entry

Keyboards

Updating Software

Check whether updates are required via the Internet, and update as required. Checking and performing available software update is free.

Saved data may be lost depending on condition of handset (malfunctioning, damaged, water seepage, etc.). It is recommended that you back up important data before updating software. The company is not responsible for damages from loss of data.

Software Update Cautions

During Update

Handset cannot be used until software is updated. It may take time to update software.

Do not remove SIM Card or power off handset during the process. It may cause an update failure. An update failure may disable handset. For details, contact Customer Service.

Signal during Update

Operate handset where signal reception is good and without changing location. Also operate with adequate battery charge. Signal becoming weak or Battery becoming low during an update may cause an update failure. An update failure may disable handset.

Other functions cannot be operated during a software update.

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Placing/Answering Calls

How to dial directly to make a call and answer a call, as well as options when a call is arriving/during a call are described.

Phone Function

Emergency Location Report

Making emergency calls (110, 119 or 118) automatically reports handset location to corresponding agency (police, etc.). This system is referred to as Emergency Location Report, and notifies location based on positioning from base stations.

- Location Report does not incur registration/transmission fees.
- Location/signal conditions affect positioning accuracy. Always provide location and call purpose.
- Hiding Caller ID (using 184, etc.) cancels Location Report.
 However, corresponding agency may obtain location information in life threatening situations.
- Location Report is not sent for calls made while outside Japan.

VoLTE and HD Voice

Handset supports VoLTE and HD Voice for higher voice call quality.

? Hints

- Q. Difficulty during call
- It may not be possible to make a call properly in a noisy location.
- A. When calling using Speaker, check the call volume. Raising the call volume may make calling difficult.
- Q. Sound pops momentarily during a call
- A. Are you changing location while calling? Sound pops when signal is weak and handset switches to a different area. This is not a malfunction.

Emergency Call Cautions

Areas Where Usable

Emergency calls from handset can be made only in SoftBank service areas.

Airplane Mode

Note that emergency calls cannot be made in Airplane mode.

Compulsor

Power off handset or set to Airplane mode before boarding an aircraft.

Handset radio waves may affect electronic devices of the aircraft.

For use in hospitals, follow the medical facility's instructions.

Do not put heavy objects on the cord of USB Type-C Cable (complimentary sample) or pull it strongly.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



When plugging or unplugging AC Charger (complimentary sample) to or from a power outlet, do not allow anything metal to come in contact.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

Do not use a voltage converter (travel converter for overseas use, etc.) when charging with AC Charger (complimentary sample).

May ignite, overheat, cause electric shock, etc.

Prohibited

Do not apply unnecessary force where connected when handset and USB Type-C Cable (complimentary sample) are connected.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.

Do Not Use Wet Hands

Use with specified power supply and voltage.

Also, use AC Charger for global use when charging overseas.

Using the incorrect power supply and voltage may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

AC Charger (complimentary sample): 100 V AC (household AC power outlet only)

AC Charger for global use: 100 V to 240 V AC (household AC power outlet only)

Compulsor

Wipe off dust on the power plug.

Using with dust adhered may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

Waterproof and dustproof may be affected under some circumstances. Warranty does not cover malfunctions resulting from misuse.

Before Use

- Close SIM Card Slot Cover firmly. Waterproof/dustproof is only effective when the cover is securely closed.
- \cdot Do not open or close SIM Card Slot Cover if hands or handset is wet.
- Do not sink handset in liquids other than tap water (seawater, pool water, water of hot spring, water with soap, detergent or bath salt contained, alcohol, juice, seasonings, etc.) or do not splash such liquid to handset.
 Also, do not use in a place where urine of pet animal is splashed. If it is splashed on handset, immediately wipe handset with a wet and clean cloth such as a wet tissue.
- Do not put handset directly on sand at beach etc. Sand or other small particles may get inside Earpiece, Mouthpiece/ Mic, Speaker, or Second Mic causing volume to drop. If sand gets inside of handset, it may cause overheating or malfunction.
- \cdot Do not use handset underwater.

- If SIM Card Slot Cover is deteriorated or damaged, waterproof/dustproof property becomes ineffective.

Closing SIM Card Slot Cover

 Insert SIM Card Tray in the direction of the arrow to the end, press firmly where circled ○, and make sure there is no gap between handset and the cover.



If any liquid other than plain water is adhered to handset

- If any liquid other than plain water (e.g. seawater, detergent, alcohol, juice) is adhered to handset, immediately wipe handset with a wet and clean cloth such as a wet tissue.
- If handset gets dirty, wipe it with a wet and clean cloth such as a wet tissue holding SIM Card Slot Cover so that it does not open. Do not use a brush.

After handset gets wet

- \cdot After handset gets wet, drain water, and wipe with a clean dry cloth.
- In cold climates, water on handset may turn to frost. Using with frosted may cause malfunction. Do not leave handset without wiping off water.

Rubber seals

- Rubber seal on the inner edges of SIM Card Slot Cover is important to maintain waterproof/dustproof property. Do not damage or remove rubber seals.
- When closing SIM Card Slot Cover, take care not to get rubber seal caught. Forcibly closing the cover with rubber seals caught may damage them resulting in loss of waterproof/ dustproof property. Just a small particle (hair etc.) between contact surfaces can cause water intrusion or dust penetration.
- If any liquid other than plain water (e.g. alcohol) is adhered to rubber seals, it may cause deterioration in durability.
- Do not insert sharp objects into grooves around SIM Card Slot Cover. Doing so may damage or deform handset, damage rubber seals, etc. causing water intrusion or dust penetration.

Replacing parts

• It is recommended to replace parts for waterproof and dustproof every 2 years regardless of their condition. For

parts replacement, contact a SoftBank Shop or Customer Service.

Heat resistance

 Do not sink handset into boiling hot water or do not splash with boiling hot water to handset. Also, do not use handset in saunas or do not expose handset to fiery winds from hair dryer etc. Handset is not resistant to high temperatures.

Shock

 Handset is not shockproof. Do not drop it or subject it to impact. Do not poke Earpiece, Mouthpiece/Mic, Speaker, Second Mic, USB Type-C Port, etc. with a pointed object. Doing so may damage or deform handset, and allow ingress of water and dust.

Draining

Charging

AC Charger (complimentary sample) is not waterproof/ dustproof. Check the following before and after charging.

- Never charge if handset is wet. May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.
- Check that handset is not wet. If charging just after handset gets wet, drain water well and wipe remaining water off with a clean dry cloth.
- Do not touch AC Charger (complimentary sample) with wet hands. May cause electric shock.
- Do not splash water over AC Charger (complimentary sample) when using it and do not use it near water such as in a bathroom, shower room, kitchen or washroom.
