- Depending on applications and services used, transmission fees may be incurred even while connected by Wi-Fi.





eSIM is a type of SIM that is embedded in a device. If your device supports an eSIM, you only need to set up a service plan that you purchased with eSIM and start using it. You don't need SIM Card.

### Updating Software

Check whether updates are required via the Internet, and update as required.

### 🖗 Before Updating Software

Saved data may be lost depending on condition of handset (malfunctioning, damaged, water seepage, etc.). It is recommended that you back up important data before updating software. The company is not responsible for damages from loss of data.

### Software Update Cautions

### **During Update**

Handset cannot be used until software is updated. It may take time to update software.

When a device is running software update, don't remove a USIM card from the device or turn its power off. Doing so can cause failure of the update and result in the device that may be inoperable or malfunction. If the device is inoperable or malfunctions, contact Customer Service.

### Signal during Update

Operate handset where signal reception is good and without changing location. Also operate with adequate battery charge. Signal becoming weak or Battery becoming low during an update may cause an update failure. An update failure may disable handset.

### If Using Other Functions

Other functions cannot be operated during a software update.





### Placing/Answering Calls

How to dial directly to make a call and answer a call, as well as options when a call is arriving/during a call are described.

### Phone Function

### **Emergency Location Report**

Making emergency calls (110, 119 or 118) automatically reports handset location to corresponding agency (police, etc.). This system is referred to as Emergency Location Report, and notifies location based on positioning from base stations.

- Location Report does not incur registration/transmission fees.
- Location/signal conditions affect positioning accuracy. Always provide location and call purpose.
- Hiding Caller ID (using 184, etc.) cancels Location Report.
   However, corresponding agency may obtain location information in life threatening situations.
- Location Report is not sent for calls made while outside Japan.

#### Before Use


- Close SIM Card Slot Cover firmly. Waterproof/dustproof is only effective when the cover is securely closed.
- Do not open or close SIM Card Slot Cover if hands or handset is wet.
- Do not sink handset in liquids other than tap water (seawater, pool water, water of hot spring, water with soap, detergent or bath salt contained, alcohol, juice, seasonings, etc.) or do not splash such liquid to handset. Also, do not use in a place where urine of pet animal is splashed. If it is splashed on handset, immediately wipe handset with a wet and clean cloth such as a wet tissue.
- Do not put handset directly on sand at beach etc. Sand, etc. in Earpiece/Speaker, Mouthpiece/Mic, Speaker, Second Mic, etc. may affect sound or enter handset, causing overheating or malfunction.
- · Do not use handset underwater.
- Do not leave handset in a humid place such as bathroom or kitchen for an extended period of time.

If any liquid other than plain water is adhered to handset

- If any liquid other than plain water (e.g. seawater, detergent, alcohol, juice) is adhered to handset, immediately wipe handset with a wet and clean cloth such as a wet tissue.

#### After handset gets wet

- $\cdot$  If any liquid other than plain water (e.g. alcohol) is adhered to rubber seals, it may cause deterioration in durability.

#### Replacing parts
