

## Tablet (Front)



Part	Description
1 Front Camera	Use to shoot photos or videos of yourself.
2 Notification/ Charging LED	Lights/flashes while charging, when powering tablet on, etc.
3 Light Sensor <sup>1</sup>	Detects surrounding brightness to adjust display brightness automatically.
4 NFC Touch Area <sup>1</sup>	Reads information on NFC devices or IC cards.
5 Display	Touchscreen-type display, operate with your fingers on Display.

1 Note that covering these parts with stickers or fingers, etc. may hinder product performance.

## NFC Touch Area


Depending on app, buttons such as "Back", "Cancel", etc. are located near NFC touch area of app, and these buttons may be tapped unintentionally by touching them with fingers or metal part of a device when putting an NFC device or IC card over tablet. In this case, try the following.

- Put an NFC device or IC card over tablet in such a way that your fingers or device do not touch the buttons on app.
- Enable Auto-rotate screen to move position of buttons by rotating tablet.

Speaker <sup>1</sup>	riedi the notrication of alarm sound.
5 Out- Camera	Capture photos and videos.
6 Shooting/	Use light when taking photos, etc.

7 USIM Card/	Attach USIM Card and SD Card.
SD Card Tray	Attach oshi cara and so cara.
8 Mic <sup>1</sup>	Use to record sound, etc.
9 Outer Case	Covers back/side part.

## Keys



Part	Description
1 Direct Key	Press once, twice, or long to activate the function assigned to each button operation.
2 Power Key/ Fingerprint Sensor	Turn Display on/off. Long Press for Power off/Reboot/ Screenshot menu; power on when powered off. If your fingerprint is registered, you can unlock tablet by fingerprint recognition.
3 Volume Down Key <sup>1</sup>	Decrease the volume.
4 Volume Up Key <sup>1</sup>	Increase the volume.

1 Volume Down/Up Key function switches depending on display orientation. In this guide, operations of Volume Keys are described when Front Camera is on upward position.

## Notification/Charging LED

Lights or blinks to notify charging status or new mail.

Lamp color and display status	Notification contents
Light-up in red	Indicates that remaining battery level is 59 % or less.
Light-up in orange	Indicates that remaining battery level is between 60 % and 89 %.
Light-up in green	Indicates that remaining battery level is 90% or more or that charging is completed.
Blinks in blue	Indicates that the tablet has received a notification of mail reception, etc.

#### eSIM

eSIM is a type of SIM that is embedded in a device. If your device supports an eSIM, you only need to set up a service plan that you purchased with eSIM and start using it. You don't need a USIM card.



#### SD Card

Tablet supports SD Cards up to 1 TB. Some SD Cards may not operate properly.

When using a new SD card for the first time, always format it on tablet.

#### SD Card Cautions

#### Data

Information stored on SD Card can become lost or changed accidentally or as a result of damage. It is recommended that you keep a separate copy of important data. SoftBank Corp. is not responsible for damages from data that is lost or changed.

#### Reading/Writing Data

Never power off while reading or writing data.

#### Battery Level

A low battery charge may prevent reading/writing to SD  $\mbox{\sc Card.}$ 

## Handling SD Card





## Charging Battery

### Charging Cautions

Never connect USB Type-C plug while tablet or peripheral equipment is wet.

### Charging with AC Charger (Optional)

AC Charger is an optional accessory. Be sure to use an AC Charger specified by SoftBank. For information on AC Charger and other peripheral devices, see SoftBank Website. Charging with AC Charger (USB Type-C™ rapid charging AC Charger with USB PD-PPS capability [ZSDBAV] (SB-AC22-TCPD)) is described as an example.



Insert USB Type-C plug of AC Charger into External Device



 $\cdot$  Holding plug by connector, insert without bending as shown.



Plug AC Charger into household AC outlet



Notification/Charging LED lights up when charging starts. Notification/Charging LED lights up green when charging ends.

· If charging is started with Battery empty, Notification/ Charging LED may not light up soon. However, charging is started.



When charging ends, disconnect USB Type-C plug from tablet, and unplug the power plug of AC Charger from outlet






### Power On/Off

#### Powering On



Long Press Power Key/Fingerprint Sensor until Display turns





- · See "Waking Tablet from Sleep" to unlock Start Screen.
- When tablet is powered on for the first time, Long Press Power Key/Fingerprint Sensor for at least 5 seconds. After that, charge tablet sufficiently.
- Startup screen appears the first time tablet is powered on. See "Making Initial Settings" to make settings.
- Do not touch the screen while logos are displayed after powering on tablet, as initial settings on touch panel are in progress. Doing so may cause touch panel to work incorrectly.





## Waking Tablet from Sleep

Display goes out after a set period of inactivity. Alternatively, Press Power Key/Fingerprint Sensor to enter sleep manually. This saves battery power and prevents accidental Touchscreen operation.

#### Sleep

Display goes out after a set period of inactivity to save

Touchscreen becomes inoperative and prevents accidental operation.

 $\cdot$  Press Power Key/Fingerprint Sensor while Display is on to enter sleep manually.

## If Tablet Enters Sleep while Music Playing

Music continues to play. After pressing Power Key/ Fingerprint Sensor while Display is off (sleep), operation panel appears in Start Screen (operation depends on application being used).

## Selecting Options and Navigating Screens

Tap items, icons, onscreen keys, etc. to open assigned items.

• Tap 🚺 to go back to previous screen.



## Menu Operations

Tap **:** for available settings and items.



Screens may also have settings and items that are available by Touching & Holding Display.



## Using Touchscreen

Tablet uses a touchscreen-type Display. Operate with your fingers on Display.

#### Tap

Contact Display lightly and briefly.



#### Touch & Hold

Contact Display lightly; release finger when screen changes.



## Drag

Touch icon or other item lightly, move it where desired, and release finger.




## Swipe/Flick

Contact Display lightly, then brush screen up/down or left/right.



#### Pinch/Spread

Contact Display lightly, then close/widen fingers.



## Silent Mode

Mute ringtones and other tablet sounds to avoid disturbing others around you.

Silent Mode Cautions

Camera shutter, video start/stop tones, Alarm, or video/ music audio sounds even when Silent mode is ON.

## **Updating Software**

Check whether updates are required via the Internet, and update as required.

## Before Updating Software

Saved data may be lost depending on condition of tablet (malfunctioning, damaged, exposure to water, etc.). It is recommended that you back up important data before updating software. SoftBank Corp. is not responsible for damages from loss of data.

## Software Update Cautions

#### During Update

Tablet cannot be used until software is updated. It may take time to update software.

When a device is running software update, don't remove a USIM card from the device or turn its power off. Doing so can cause failure of the update and result in the device that may be inoperable or malfunction. If the device is inoperable or malfunctions, contact Customer Service.

#### Signal during Update

Operate tablet where signal reception is good and without changing location. Also operate with adequate battery charge. Signal becoming weak or Battery becoming low during an update may cause an update failure. An update failure may disable tablet.

#### Home Screen & Apps Menu

Part	Description

2 Standby area	Place application shortcuts, folders, widgets freely.
3 Quick launch area	Tap an icon to launch application or function. Customize Home Screen with application shortcuts, widgets, and folders.
4 Navigation Bar	Tap an icon to operate.

## Portrait Orientation & Landscape Orientation

When tablet is rotated upright, appears on Navigation Bar. Tap to change screen to portrait orientation. To change to landscape orientation, rotate tablet sideways and Tap to When Auto-rotate screen is enabled and tablet is rotated upright, screen automatically changes to portrait orientation.

 Depending on the current screen, the orientation may not change even by changing tablet orientation.



#### Multi-Window

Split screen to view and operate 2 applications. Activate the 2 applications beforehand. Viewing and operating (Chrome) and (Maps) is described as an example.

 $\cdot$  Multi-Window is unavailable with some applications.

## Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) Information of This Product (for Japan)

This device [A404KC] complies with the Japanese technical regulations and international guidelines regarding exposure to radio waves.

This device was designed in observance of the Japanese technical regulations regarding exposure to radio waves (\*1) and the limits of exposure recommended in the international guidelines, which are equivalent to each other. The international guidelines were set out by the International Commission on Non-Ionizing Radiation Protection (ICNIRP), which is in collaboration with the World Health Organization (WHO), and the permissible limits include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health conditions.

The technical regulations and the international guidelines set out the limits of exposure to radio waves as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR, which is the value of absorbed energy in any 10 grams of human tissue over a 6-minute period. The SAR limit for mobile phones including this device is 2.0 W/kg. The highest SAR value for this device when worn on the body is 1.183 W/kg (\*2). There may be slight differences of the SAR values in individual product, but they all satisfy the limit.

The actual value of SAR of this device while operating can be well below the indicated above. This is due to automatic changes in the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum power required to access the network.
