#### Data Communication

- Tablet is designed to be always connected to the Internet.
   Communication is initiated automatically for some functions such as data syncing.
- Large-volume data communication, such as downloading applications and viewing videos, incurs expensive transmission fees. Subscription to a flat-rate plan is strongly recommended.
- Even if connected by Wi-Fi, some applications and services incur transmission fees.





## Tablet (Front)




Part	Description
<b>1</b> Brightness Sensor	Detects ambient light level, etc.
2 Front Camera	Use to shoot photos or videos of yourself.
3 Display	Touchscreen-type display, operate with vour fingers on Display.

## Tablet (Back and Sides)



Part	Description
1 USIM/SD Card Tray	Install/remove USIM Card and SD Card.
2 Light	Use to shoot photos or videos of yourself.
3 Speaker	Listen to music, video sound, etc.
4 Headphone Port	Connect headphones, etc.
5 USB Type- C™ Port	Connect Micro USB Cable.
6 Mic	Use such as when recording video.
7 Camera	Capture photos and videos.



#### eSIM

eSIM is an integrated SIM already built into tablet. An eSIM-capable tablet allows you to use a phoneline simply with a contract subscription and configuring tablet, without the needed replacement of SIM cards.

## **Unlocking Screen**

Display is locked after a set period of inactivity. Alternatively, Press Power Key for manual screen lock. This saves battery power and prevents accidental Touchscreen operation.

#### Screen Lock

After a period of inactivity, Display turns off to save battery power (Screen lock active). Screen lock prevents accidental Touchscreen operation.

## **Updating Software**

Check whether updates are required via the Internet, and update as required.

#### 👸 Before Updating Software

Saved data may be lost depending on condition of tablet (malfunctioning, damaged, exposure to water, etc.). It is recommended that you back up important data before updating software. The company is not responsible for damages from loss of data.

#### Software Update Cautions

#### During Update

Tablet cannot be used until software is updated. It may take time to update software. When a device is running software update, don't remove a USIM card from the device or turn its power off. Doing so can cause failure of the update and result in the device that may be inoperable or malfunction. If the device is inoperable or malfunctions, contact Customer Service.

#### Signal during Update

Operate tablet where signal reception is good and without changing location. Also operate with adequate battery charge. Signal becoming weak or Battery becoming low during an update may cause an update failure. An update failure may disable tablet.





# Home Screen & App List

Most tablet operations start in "Home Screen" that appears after unlocking the screen, or in "app list". Flick Home Screen up or tap 🔡 for "app list".





## Home Screen Layout



Item	Description
1 Status Bar	Flick down for Notifications Window.
2 Entertainment Space	Open Entertainment Space, which allows you to search contents such as movies, TV shows, games, etc. without switching apps.
3 Taskbar (Favorites Tray)	Place application shortcuts, folders, etc. Appears even when Home Screen sheets toggled.
4 Customize Area	Place application shortcuts, folders, widgets freely.
5 App List	Open App List.
<b>6</b> Taskbar (Navigation Bar) <sup>1</sup>	Flick bar to operate.  Flick up Open Home screen.  Flick left/right Switch apps.  Flick up and hold your finger Open the list of recently used apps (app history). Start an app or check app information from icon or thumbnail.  Flick up briefly and hold your finger while an app is activated Open Taskbar (Favorites Tray) over apps.

1 Appears when System navigation is set to "Gesture navigation."

Use of tablet on board an aircraft is restricted. Follow instructions of the airline.

If any functions that power on tablet automatically are activated, deactivate them.

Radio waves may adversely affect an aircraft's electronic devices.

Prohibited use aboard an aircraft may be subject to penalty by law.



For use at a hospital, follow the instructions of the institution.

Power off tablet where its use is prohibited. If any functions that power on tablet automatically are activated, deactivate them.

Radio waves may affect electronic equipment or electronic medical devices.



Adjust to an adequate volume when using earphones or similar accessory to play games or play back videos/music.

Even in standby, alarm may sound suddenly. Listening to loud sound continuously for a long time may cause hearing impairment or other difficulty.

In addition, not being able to hear surroundings may cause an accident.



Users with a heart condition should adjust vibration/ringtone volume as needed.

Tablet suddenly vibrating and ringing may startle and affect persons with heart conditions.



If wearing an electronic medical device or similar apparatus, check with the manufacturer or vendor regarding any effect that radio waves may have on it.

Radio waves may adversely affect electronic medical devices, etc.



Power off tablet near electronic equipment that uses precision control or faint signals.

Radio waves may cause electronic equipment to malfunction or may adversely affect operation.

devices, and other automatically controlled devices or
equipment. If using an implanted cardiac pacemaker,

If Display or Camera lens breaks, be careful with broken parts and exposed tablet parts.

Touching broken or exposed parts may cause burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



If Internal Battery leaks or has an unusual smell, immediately stop using tablet, and keep away from fire.

Leaking fluid may ignite, causing fire, rupture, etc.



Do not allow pets, etc. to bite tablet.

Internal Battery igniting, rupturing, overheating, or leaking may cause fire, burns, injury, etc.

# **⚠** CAUTION



Before using the motion sensor, ensure safety around you, hold tablet firmly, and do not move it more than necessary.

May cause injury or other accident.



If Display is broken, do not allow leaking substance to come in contact with your skin (face, hands, etc.), clothes, etc.

May harm sight or skin.

If leaking substance gets in your eyes, mouth, etc. or on your skin or clothes, immediately rinse with clean water. If it gets in your eyes, mouth, etc., rinse and promptly seek medical attention.



Do not dispose of tablet together with ordinary trash.

May cause fire, burns, injury, etc. May also adversely affect the environment. Bring old tablet where accepted such as a SoftBank Shop, or follow municipal instructions for recycling.



If substance in Internal Battery leaks, do not let it get on your skin (face, hands, etc.) or clothes.

May harm sight or skin.

If leaking substance gets in your eyes, mouth, etc. or on your skin or clothes, immediately rinse with clean water. If it gets in your eyes, mouth, etc., rinse and promptly seek medical attention.



Be careful not to scratch yourself (finger, etc.) with the tip of USIM/SD Card Removal Tool (complimentary sample) when removing USIM Card.

Contact with the tip of USIM/SD Card Removal Tool (complimentary sample) may cause injury, etc.



Before using tablet in a car, check with the car manufacturer or dealer regarding any effect that radio waves may have on it.

Tablet radio waves may affect the vehicle's electronic equipment in some car models. In such case, cease using tablet.



If skin abnormalities develop during use, immediately stop using tablet and seek medical attention.

Tablet use may cause itching, a rash, eczema, etc. depending on your physical condition.

For materials of each part, see "Materials (Tablet)" and "Materials (USIM/SD Card Removal Tool)."



Tablet speaker and vibrator use magnetic parts; check that nothing metal (cutter blades, staples, etc.) is adhering.

Anything adhering may cause injury, etc.



View display in a well-lit place at an adequate distance.

Viewing in a dark place or too closely may affect eyesight, etc.

#### AC Charger (Optional Accessory)

### **⚠ WARNING**



Do not use if the cord of AC Charger (optional accessory) is damaged.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Do not touch AC Charger (optional accessory) if you hear thunder.

May cause electric shock, etc.



Do not short-circuit Charging Terminal when it is connected to an outlet. Do not allow any part of yourself (hands, fingers, etc.) to come in contact with Charging Terminal.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Do not place heavy objects on the cord of AC Charger (optional accessory) or apply excessive force such as by pulling.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



When plugging in/unplugging AC Charger (optional accessory), keep metal objects away.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Do not use a voltage converter (travel converter for overseas use, etc.) when charging with AC Charger (optional accessory).

May ignite, overheat, cause electric shock, etc.



Do not apply excessive force to where tablet and AC Charger (optional accessory) are connected.

May cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Do not touch the cord of AC Charger (optional accessory), Charging Terminal, or power plug with wet hands.

May cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Always use the specified power supply and voltage.

Also, use an AC Charger for overseas use when charging abroad.

Incorrect power supply and voltage may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

AC Charger (optional accessory): 100 V AC (household AC power outlet only)

AC Charger for overseas use: 100 V to 240 V AC (household AC power outlet only)



Wipe off any dust on power plug.

Using while dusty may cause fire, burns, electric shock,



Insert the power plug of AC Charger (optional accessory) in outlet firmly.

Not doing so may cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



When unplugging from an outlet, grasp AC Charger (optional accessory) body and do not pull cord or otherwise subject to excessive force.

Pulling cord of AC Charger (optional accessory) may damage it and cause fire, burns, electric shock, etc.



Insert or remove the connector of AC Charger (optional accessory) without bending or applying force such as pulling cord.

Not doing so correctly may cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



Stop use immediately if Charging Terminal is bent or otherwise deformed. Also, do not repair Charging Terminal to use it.

Short-circuiting of Charging Terminal may cause fire, burns, injury, electric shock, etc.



When not in use, unplug from outlet.

Leaving plugged in may cause fire, burns, electric shock,



If splashed with water or other liquid (beverage, sweat, seawater, pet urine, etc.), immediately unplug from outlet.

Splashing can cause short-circuiting, causing fire, burns, electric shock, etc.

#### Handling near Electronic Medical Devices

If you have an electric medical device such as an implanted pacemaker or implanted cardioverter defibrillator, or if there may be someone with such a device around you, keep tablet at least 15 cm away from the device.

Radio waves may affect operation of electronic medical devices.

Switch tablet not to emit radio waves (Airplane mode, power tablet off, etc.) beforehand when people around you may come closer than 15 cm to you where you cannot move freely.



When using an electronic medical device (other than an implanted cardiac pacemaker/ defibrillator) outside medical facilities, check with the device manufacturer, etc. regarding any effect that radio waves may have on it.

Radio waves may affect operation of electronic medical devices.



Observe a medical facility's instructions when using the terminal.

Radio waves may affect operation of electronic medical devices.

#### General Notes

#### General Use

- $\cdot$  Do not expose to water.
- Tablet and AC Charger (optional accessory) are not waterproof. Do not use in high humidity (e.g., bath room) or where exposed to rain, etc. If carrying tablet on you, humidity from perspiration can corrode the tablet interior and cause malfunction. Tablet will not be covered by warranty and may not be repairable in some instances if malfunction is determined to be due to such water exposure. Since tablet is not covered by warranty in this instance, repairs will be made at cost if tablet is repairable.
- Avoid using tablet in extremely high or low temperatures, in high humidity, or where extremely dusty.
   Use within temperatures of O°C to 35°C and humidity 35% to 85%.
- · Do not use in these locations.
- Where there is much humidity, dust, or vibration
- Near a landline, TV, radio, etc.
- Note that tablet may become warm when used a long time, and particularly in warm surroundings.
- $\cdot$  Stop using tablet a while if warm. Prolonged contact with tablet while warm may cause low-temperature burns.
- Avoid touching tablet USB Type-C™ Port and Headphone Port. Static electricity may affect internal components.
- · Use a soft, dry cloth to clean any oil, splashing, or other hard-to-remove soiling. Do not operate with fingernails to prevent scratching Display. Wiping with alcohol, thinner, benzine, detergent, etc. may remove print or fade colors.
- Clean terminal occasionally with a dry cotton swab, etc.
   Soiling on terminal can cause a poor connection or tablet to power off and inadequate charging. Avoid damaging terminal when cleaning.
- Do not remove USIM Card when sending or saving data with tablet. May erase data or affect tablet.
- Be sure to read information on health and safety before using tablet. A flashing image when playing a game or viewing videos may cause dizziness or convulsions. If these symptoms are experienced, consult a doctor.
- Do not place tablet near magnetic stripe cards or other magnetic objects. Tablet magnetic field may corrupt information on a memory card or credit card.
- · Metal is used in tablet. Tablet use may cause itching, a rash, skin irritation, etc. depending on your physical condition.
- $\cdot$  Do not paint tablet. Paint may clog interior and affect operation.

#### Internal Battery

- · Battery is built in and is not removable.
- Internal Battery can recharge and discharge at least several hundred times, but will eventually wear out.
   Internal Battery should be replaced if usable time shortens noticeably even after ample charging. Replace Internal Battery.
- Tablet can be submitted for Internal Battery replacement at a fee at a "SoftBank Shop". Ask at a SoftBank Shop or Customer Service. You should not try to replace Internal Battery yourself; risk of fire, explosion, etc.
- Functions that use communication such as Bluetooth® or Wi-Fi® and are enabled use more battery power. It is recommended to disable such functions when not in use.
- · Brightening screen uses more battery power. Lower screen brightness with "Brightness" setting to reduce battery power used.

#### Lithium-Ion Polymer Battery

 Tablet uses a lithium-ion polymer battery. Lithium-ion polymer batteries are recyclable precious resources. Bring them to the nearest shop with the Mobile Recycle Network mark.



# Charging

- AC Charger is an optional accessory. Be sure to use an AC Charger specified by SoftBank. For information on AC Charger and other peripheral devices, see SoftBank website. Using any other charger may cause Internal Battery to leak, overheat, or cause a fire. The company is not responsible whatsoever for damages from any accident or trouble as a result of using any other charger.
- Do not force tablet and AC Charger (optional accessory) to connect if they cannot be connected easily.
- When using AC Charger (optional accessory), be careful
  of anything conductive (anything metal, pencil lead, etc.)
  touching the plug when plugging it in. May cause electric
  shock, short circuit, fire, etc.
- Plug AC Charger (optional accessory) directly in outlet. A power extension bar may overheat and cause a fire.
- · When plugging AC Charger (optional accessory) in outlet, do not subject it to impact such as by getting caught on something. May cause injury or malfunction.
- Do not use AC Charger (optional accessory) if plug is damaged or sits loosely in outlet.
- $\cdot$  Avoid charging in these locations.
- Under direct sunlight
- Where there is much humidity, dust, or vibration
- Near a TV, radio, or other electric device

#### For Safe Driving

- Use while driving is dangerous. Follow the laws and regulations of the country or region where using tablet.
   Before using tablet, first stop the vehicle in a location where it is safe to use tablet.
- Do not store tablet or accessories in the same location as liquids or flammable gas. Do not place tablet on top of where an airbag is stowed. May hinder airbag if airbag is activated.
- Electromagnetic fields, surroundings, or otherwise magnetic objects may affect compass accuracy. It should only be used as a reference.
- · If you do not wish to disclose location information, do not use applications that record location information.
- When searching for locations, buildings, routes, or distances, do not rely only on map shown on tablet, and use it only as a reference. Maps, routes, and locations are provided by service providers, and information is constantly being updated. This functionality is not supported in some locations, and therefore map routes and compass are sometimes inaccurate, incomplete, and unsupported.

#### Environment of Use

- When in a location where tablet use is prohibited, or where there is a risk of interference or danger, power off tablet.
- Radio wave interference may affect operation of other electronic equipment or cause other issues.
- Use of tablet in some vehicles can occasionally affect invehicle electronic equipment. Exercise safety and do not use tablet in such instances.
- Before connecting tablet or accessories to other devices, read the instructions for the device and be sure to understand safety information.
- $\cdot$  Do not connect tablet to noncompatible products.

#### **Emergency Alerts**

- When an emergency alert is received, tablet notifies user via message, alert, and by vibrating.
  - Emergency alerts are enabled by default (can also be disabled).
  - By default, alert sounds at maximum volume even when Silent mode is set, and vibration is enabled regardless of Silent mode setting (can be changed).
- See "緊急速報メールを利用する" in the 取扱説明書 (Japanese) for details on emergency alert settings.
- Depending on usage/situation, tablet may receive emergency alerts for other areas or no emergency alerts.

#### Display (Touchscreen)

- Touchscreen-type display, operate with your fingers on Display.
- The touchscreen is designed to be touched lightly. Do not press strongly with your fingers or with anything pointed (fingernails, ball-point pen, pin, etc.).
- The touchscreen may not respond to touch operation in these situations. Note that malfunction may occur.
- Use with gloves
- Use with fingernails
- Use with an object on the touchscreen
- Use with water droplets or condensation on Display
- Use when your fingers are wet or sweaty
- Use underwater
- Stop use immediately if Display is broken. Avoid touching or removing broken parts, and immediately contact a SoftBank Shop or Customer Service.
- · If Display has been exposed to liquid, metal dust, or other matter, immediately clean it.

#### Volume

 Avoid listening to audio at a loud volume for a prolonged time.



# USIM/SD Card Removal Tool (Complimentary Sample)

- Do not insert USIM/SD Card Removal Tool (complimentary sample) in hole other than hole in USIM/SD Card Tray. May cause malfunction or damage.
- Do not apply excessive force. May cause malfunction or damage.
- $\boldsymbol{\cdot}$  Dispose of as separate waste according to local regulations.
- Do not use USIM/SD Card Removal Tool (complimentary sample) in other mobile terminals. May cause malfunction or damage to mobile terminal.

#### Personal Information and Data Security

- · Use of some functions and third-party applications on tablet may allow leakage of personal information, loss of data, or access by third parties. The company recommends that you take measures to protect personal information and sensitive information.
- · Leave tablet in a safe location where it cannot be used unauthorized.
- It is recommended that you set a screen lock on tablet that requires a password, facial recognition, etc.
- · Back up personal information to USIM Card, storage, or SD Card regularly. Before changing to another tablet, be sure to move or delete personal information from tablet.
- Any received messages or mail that do not appear familiar may be a risk of virus infection. Delete them immediately without opening them.
- · When using tablet to search the Internet, avoid accessing websites that may be a security risk, to prevent your personal information from being stolen.
- Set passwords to Wi-Fi tethering and Bluetooth® to prevent unauthorized access. Set these functions off when not using them.
- Tablet initiates software updates regularly to enhance security. Always use the most recent software so as to maintain tablet safety. It is recommended that you run a virus scan regularly.
- Always obtain applications created by third parties from official sites. Be sure to run a virus scan when downloading applications.
- Some applications request that location information be sent, and share location information with creators of the application. In this instance, tablet may send any retrieved information and diagnostic information to third-party application providers.

Third-party vendors use this information for product and service improvement.

- · Tablet is certified as conforming to technical standards as a wireless device of a radio station in a low-power data transmission system based on the Radio Law, and its "technical conformity mark

# Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (Wireless LAN) Functions

# Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (Wireless LAN) Functions

- · Connection/operation may not be possible with some Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) devices.
- · Tablet is equipped with Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN)-compliant security features for communication via Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN). However, these may be inadequate depending on environment of usage and settings. Be aware when using Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN).
- The company is not responsible for any data or information which may be leaked during communication via Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN).

#### Frequency Bands (2.4 GHz Band)

Frequency bands used by tablet Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) functions are as below.





- 2.4: Wireless facility using 2400 MHz band. FH/DS/OF: FH-SS/DS-SS/OFDM modulation.
- 4: Expected maximum interference range of about 40 m.
- 8: Expected maximum interference range of about 80 m.

: Utilizes 2,400 MHz to 2,483.5 MHz band without mobile device bandwidth differentiation.

: Utilizes 2,400 MHz to 2,483.5 MHz band with mobile device bandwidth differentiation.

Usable channels depend on the country.

Before using aboard an aircraft, check with the airline beforehand.

#### Frequency Bands (5 GHz Band)

Within the 5 GHz frequency band, tablet can use the 5.2 GHz (W52), 5.3 GHz (W53), and 5.6 GHz (W56) bands.

- · 5.2 GHz band (W52/36, 40, 44, 48 ch)
- · 5.3 GHz band (W53/52, 56, 60, 64 ch)
- · 5.6 GHz band (W56/100, 104, 108, 112, 116, 120, 124, 128, 132, 136, 140, 144 ch)

Using a 5.2/5.3-GHz-band wireless LAN outdoors is prohibited by law (this does not apply to communication with access points/relay stations of high-output data communications systems operating in the 5.2 GHz band).

#### **Usage Cautions**

Tablet Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) functions use the same frequency band used by household appliances (microwave ovens) and industrial/scientific/medical equipment as well as by in-place radio stations (requiring a license) and specific low-power radio stations (not requiring a license) for mobile identification as used in production lines, and by amateur radio stations (requiring a license).

- 1. Before using tablet Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) functions, check that no in-place radio stations for mobile identification, specific low-power radio stations, or amateur radio stations are in operation nearby.
- 2. If use of Bluetooth®/Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) functions causes interference with regard to an in-place radio stations for mobile identification, immediately change the usage frequency, or discontinue use and take measures to avoid interference (putting a partition in place, etc.).
- 3. If tablet is otherwise a cause of interference with regard to specific low-power radio stations for mobile identification or amateur radio stations and assistance is required, contact Customer Service.

# Bluetooth® and Wi-Fi (Wireless LAN) Devices and Interference

Bluetooth® and Wi-Fi (IEEE 802.11 a/b/g/n/ac) use the same frequency band (2.4 GHz). Using Bluetooth® near a Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) access point or wireless LAN device may cause interference, resulting in lower communication speed and poor connection. In this instance, prevent interference difficulty such as by using tablet and the Bluetooth® device being connected at a distanced location, or powering off the Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) device.

#### Wi-Fi (Wireless LAN)

Do not use Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) where there is an electromagnetic field such as near electrical appliances or AV/ OA devices.

- Magnetic fields may increase electrical noise or may affect communication. Tablet may in particular be affected by a microwave oven.
- · It may interfere with reception if near a TV, radio, etc., or the TV screen may become unviewable.
- If multiple Wi-Fi (wireless LAN) access points using the same channel are in proximity, tablet may not detect access points correctly.

# Waterproofing/Dustproofing

Tablet is rated by the IP Code (JIS C 0920) to IPX3 $^1$  water resistance in daily use and IP5X $^2$  dust resistance when USIM/SD Card Tray is installed properly.

- 1 IPX3: maintains functionality as a tablet after exposure to water spray from both directions in a range up to 60 degrees from vertical.
- 2 IP5X: maintains functionality as a tablet and maintains its safety after being agitated in a test device with 75  $\mu m$  or smaller particles for 8 hours.
- Never install/remove USIM/SD Card Tray with wet hands or while tablet is wet.
- Immersion or washing with water are not covered by warranty.

#### When Using Tablet

- Before using tablet, install USIM/SD Card Tray securely and completely. For details on installation, see "USIM Card."
   Anything tiny (a minute fiber, a single hair, a grain of sand, etc.) caught in it may allow ingress of water.
- Do not use where water is used, in a bathing room, or in strong rain.
- Do not get wet with liquids other than normal-temperature water such as the following.
- Soap/detergent/bath powder
- Seawater
- Pool water
- Hot spring water
- · If tablet gets dirty, wipe the surface gently with a soft cloth having isopropyl alcohol or with a general cleansing sheet (containing 70% isopropyl alcohol). Be careful not to let humidity or liquid in gaps or openings. Note that discoloration, fading, peeling, and deformation are possible, as well as accelerated deterioration if tablet coating is scratched.
- Do not subject tablet to strong impact and deform it. May affect water resistance in daily use/dust resistance.

#### **Important**

- If tablet is exposed to liquids with USIM/SD Card Tray unsecured, they may enter tablet and cause electric shock or malfunction. Power off tablet and do not continue to use it, and contact a SoftBank Shop or Customer Service.
- Do not leave wet. In a cold region, it may freeze and result in malfunction.
- To prevent condensation, let tablet adjust to room temperature before bringing it from a cold location to a bath room or other warm location.
- $\cdot$  USIM Card and AC Charger (optional accessory) are not waterproof.
- Do not use in a sauna, or subject to hot airflow (from a hair drver etc.).
- · Do not place directly on sand, etc.
- Sand may enter the Mic or Speaker holes and affect sound.
- Allowing moisture, sand, etc. to remain may cause sound to crackle.
- Anything tiny such as a grain of sand being caught between USIM/SD Card Tray and tablet body may allow ingress of water.
- Do not poke Mic or Speaker with a cotton swab or anything pointed. May affect water resistance in daily use/dust resistance
- $\cdot$  Do not leave wet. May short-circuit charging terminal or USB Type-C  $^{\text{TM}}$  Port.
- Do not drop. Scratches, etc. can deteriorate water resistance in daily use/dust resistance.
- Do not allow moisture to remain in Mic, Speaker, etc. May cause misoperation or wet clothes/bag. In this instance, wipe away moisture with a dry, clean cloth.
- Do not connect headphones when tablet is wet. May cause malfunction.
- Do not use USB Type-C™ Port if wet or dirty/dusty. May affect water resistance in daily use/dust resistance, or may cause electric shock and short-circuiting, resulting in malfunction, burns, or fire.
- · Do not leave in a humid location for a long time.
- · Avoid bringing tablet from cold outdoors to a warm room suddenly; place in a room first to let it warm up before bringing it in.
- Touchscreen may not operate properly if the display has any water droplets on it.
